The Redrick Leijon Nicholas Williams Scholarship was established in memory of Redrick Leijon Nicholas Williams, honoring his service to the community, youth, and education.

Redrick was born and raised in Greater Los Angeles and graduated from George Washington Preparatory High School. He was reared by a single mother who instilled the importance of servitude and education. At age 14, he began volunteering in Los Angeles County and dedicated his life to serving others for over 30 years.

Through his service professionally and as an active community member, Redrick touched many lives. He was passionate as a school administrator for the Victor Valley Union High School District, where he was able to be an active role model for black students.

Redrick was also an active community leader in Lynwood while serving as Head Deacon of Greater Emmanuel Temple. From offering counseling, facilitating community events to overseeing recreational activities, such as nightly basketball at G.E.T., Redrick made an impact bridging the gap between the streets and church.

As an entrepreneur, Redrick was committed to creating opportunities for success, conversation, and uplifting inner-city African American male youth as a licensed Bails Bondsman. He majored in Electronics and Telecommunications at Victor Valley College and believed in having a trade or higher learning as a way to empower yourself to grow. He instilled these same values into his son and the youth he mentored.



REQUIREMENTS



ELIGIBILITY: The Redrick Leijon Nicholas Williams Scholarship is for an African-American/Black male, raised by a single mother, graduating high school student and living in Los Angeles County who will either be attending an accredited 4 year college/university, 2 year community/junior college, or vocational/trade school. The applicant must be from a single-parent home, raised by their mother.

Please complete the application form in black or blue ink. All information, especially the contact information, should be LEGIBLE.

Applicant must be an African-American/Black male living in Los Angeles County.

Applicant is being raised by a single mother.

Applicant must submit an official high school transcript in a sealed envelope. If submitting an unofficial transcript, it must be signed by your counselor, sealed in an envelope with their signature written on the sealed flap and mailed, by your counselor, directly to the scholarship.

DEADLINE: MAY 1, 2022

Applicant must submit three letters of recommendation with their application. Letters of recommendation should be typed, dated, on official letterhead, and include the contact information of the letter's writer. The letters must be signed by your recommender, sealed in an envelope with their signature written on the sealed flap. Letters of recommendation are accepted from teachers, guidance counselors, principals, church leaders, employers and/or community service representatives. Letters of recommendation cannot come from family members.

Applicant must submit a heartfelt and creative 90 second video describing the significance of their single mother and her sacrifices in raising the applicant. Video should be submitted through the website www.my-get.org/scholarship or via WeTransfer.com to RedrickLNWilliamsScholarship@gmail.com with your name and the words "VIDEO SUBMISSION" in the subject line.

Applicant must submit a 500 or more words written essay, typed, double-spaced. Essay should convey clear, original thought supported by personal experiences, observations, and/or research.
